Medical engineer

Someone who checks medical equipment to make sure it is working correctly before it gets used!

Re-constructive scientist

Someone using prosthetics to reconstruct parts of a persons body (usually in the face).

Rehabilitation engineer

Someone who designs artificial body parts, measures walking characteristics, improves the function of artificial limbs, and surgical corrections of deformities.
