Clinical Support Worker

Someone who assists Nurses, Therapists, Midwives, Doctors and other health care professionals, covering a massive range of specialisms.

Radiation Safety Physicist

Someone who checks the equipment and chemicals in radiation treatments, are safe for the patient and doctor.

Clinical Perfusion Scientist

Someone who looks after a persons circulation while they're in surgery. Using machines to take over the role of the heart and lungs to keep the patient alive.
