What careers are there for me in the NHS?

Analytical Toxicologist

Someone who examines blood, urine and other bodily products to work out what poisons someone may have been injected with or which drug has caused an overdose in a person.

Infection scientist

Someone who runs tests to diagnose infectious diseases and figures out the best treatment for them.

Geneticist

Someone who examines the DNA of patients to find any inherited genetic diseases.

What do the people in those careers think of it?
