### Emergency Macular Clinic at the Manchester Royal Eye Hospital

At the appointment with your Optometrist today, they noticed something at the back of your eye which they have arranged for you to have investigated urgently.

Your optometrist is concerned you may have a sight threatening macular condition, which means you need to be seen quickly at the Manchester Royal Eye Hospital.

You will be called with the appointment details for you to be reviewed at a clinic, to see if treatment is indicated. We run clinics at 4 locations around the city, please ensure you note the correct location.

#### What to expect at the appointment

- Some questions about your eye
- Vision measurements
- Dilating drops will be put into your eyes to help examine them. These will make your vision blurred
- OCT scan, this is a special scan of the back of your eye

If the information shows you need some treatment, you may be offered this on the same day. A clinician will come and talk to you about the treatment, which is an injection to the eye.

If there is no indication for treatment on the day, you will be advised to leave the hospital. A clinician will review your notes and scans from your visit within the next 24 hours. You will then be sent a letter explaining what the scan has shown, what will happen next and if treatment is needed.

**Please do not drive to this appointment – as the dilating drops will blur your vision for a number of hours.**
