

I think you are probably aware that our financial year ended on 31st January and I am pleased to be able to tell you that our total net income for 2017/18 was £33,958.10. Added to this amount was a small balance left in our bank account from the previous year and this enabled us to send £34,001.80 to Cancer Research UK Head Office in Oxford. This money will be ring fenced for use by CRUK staff who work in Nottingham at the University and will be used to cover a wide range of research.

Our main income is the "In Memoriam" donations and totalled £30,238. This is a large sum of money and everyone at CRUK are very grateful to have received it.


Coincidence from Steve Wakeling

The following story is from a funeral that Julia asked me to officiate from the West Bridgford office. As usual Julia had wanted to fit the right celebrant with the family and as I had served in the Royal Navy and the deceased lady had also served as a WREN during World War II, she decided we would be a good match.

I arranged to see the family and helped to put the lady's service documents in chronological order, my understanding of naval terminology helped with this. We then starting talking about the eulogy, I asked about the deceased lady's family, including her father and his occupation, and the family recalled he (Albert) was a tradesman painter and decorator who had served in the British Army during World War I, in the Royal Engineers and was in battles including Ypres and the Somme. I thought this was a coincidence as my grandfather, John Alfred Hutchinson, by trade was also a tradesman painter and decorator who served in the British Army during the War, with the Royal Engineers. During the visit the family showed me a photograph of Albert with six men from the Royal Engineers with a cross marking him, on the front left-hand side.

When the Celebration of Life took place at Wilford Hill, the family handed me the copy of the photograph on a folded piece of A4. I kept the paper leaving it on my desk at home. The next morning, I was clearing up, when I notice another picture on the back, this one, with four Royal Engineers, Albert with a "Cross" below him - on the front left and to my surprise - on the right front, was my Granddad - John Alfred Hutchinson...

None of this could have happened without Julia, another example of her being a true professional and matching the right officiant to the right family.
