# In Loving Memory

#### JOAN SPURR (née LYMN) 1922 – 2020



*Joan and Sheila* We are sad to announce the death, on 14th November 2020, of Joan Spurr née Lymn.

Auntie Joan was the daughter of Harold (HP) and Isabel Lymn (Bella) and granddaughter of A W Lymn. Joan was born "over the shop" on Bath Street in 1922 as the second child of Harold and Bella. Sadly their first born, Kenneth, died in infancy very soon after Joan was born. Two further children followed with Douglas in 1925 (died 1984) and Sheila "our mum" thereafter but Joan was always the big sister.

Joan married Dennis Spurr at the beginning of WW2 and they had a long and fulfilling life together producing five children John, Elaine, Christopher, Deborah and Carol. For many years Joan and Dennis owned and ran a Spar shop and a greengrocery/floristry shop, County Florist on Carlton Hill in which all their girls were involved. This was eventually sold and the three girls relocated to the old police station on Robin Hood Street when we established City Flowers.

Joan was surrounded by a loving and devoted family with eight grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren. Her final years were spent in a care home where she was happy and well cared for. She was immensely and quite rightly proud of the Lymn heritage never missing the opportunity to remind staff that she was "Harold Lymn's daughter".

She will be buried next to her beloved Dennis at Burton Joyce Cemetery, after a long and very fulfilling life.
